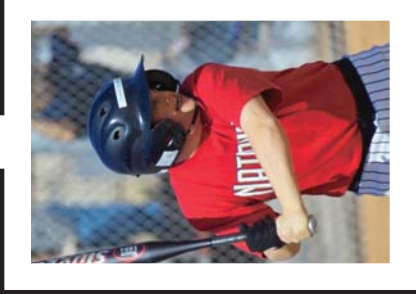
## We Believe:
